



- To share a unique resource that provides ongoing marriage mystagogy to spouses






CATECHUMENAL PATHWAYS FOR MARRIED LIFE



- ➤ 2022 Document of the Vatican Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life
- ➤ Responds to the concern of Pope Francis for a marriage catechumenate
- Calls for renewed pastoral care and accompaniment of spouses



CATECHUMENAL PATHWAYS FOR MARRIED LIFE



- ➤ In continuity with Pope St. John Paul II's call for a catechumenal process for those preparing for marriage (*Familiaris* consortio, 66-69)
- Follows the stages of the baptismal catechumenate
- ➤ Marriage mystagogy in which spouses are accompanied through the first few years of marriage




THE LEGACY OF ST. JOHN PAUL II



"In order that the family may be ever more a true community of love, it is necessary that all its members should be helped and trained in their responsibilities as they face the new problems that arise, in mutual service, and in active sharing in family life. This holds true especially for young families, which, finding themselves in a context of new values and responsibilities, are more vulnerable

THE CALL OF POPE FRANCIS



"I would like to stress the need for a 'new catechumenate' for marriage preparation. ... [J] ust as the catechumenate is part of the sacramental process for the baptism of adults, so too may the preparation for marriage form an integral part of the whole sacramental process of marriage

"A second remedy is that of helping the newlyweds to follow up their journey in the faith and in the Church, also after the marriage celebration. It is necessary to identify, with courage and creativity, a formation plan for young married couples, with initiatives aimed at increasing their awareness of the sacrament they have received."



REASONS FOR A MARRIAGE CATECHUMENATE


""The catechumenate can inspire new methods for faith renewal in every age, because it proposes a type of accompaniment for people - pedagogical, gradual, and ritualized – which always retains its effectiveness. ... It aims to let the mystery of sacramental grace resonate among the spouses, since it belongs to them by virtue of the sacrament: it seeks to bring to life the presence of Christ in them and among them"

THREE PRINCIPLES FOR PASTORAL RENEWAL

- Interconnectedness: "The future of the world passes through the family" (John Paul II, Familiaris consortio, 75) (Pathways, 12)
- Synodality: Emphasizes the co-responsibility of spouses and their families for the Church's mission of holiness and evangelization (*Pathways*, 13)
- Continuity: Stresses that marriage is a vocation which gradually unfolds over the course of a lifetime (*Pathways*, 14)





PHASES AND STAGES

- ➤ Precatechumenal Phase: Remote preparation (*Pathways*, 27-47)
- ➤ Catechumenal Phase: Proximate and immediate preparation (*Pathways*, 48-73)
- ➤ **Accompaniment**: Marriage mystagogy (*Pathways*, 74-86)



ACCOMPANIMENT DURING FIRST YEARS OF MARRIAGE



"The entire process should not be understood as an isolated act, but rather as the entry into a 'permanent state,' which therefore requires a unique 'ongoing formation' involving reflection, dialogue and help from the Church. For this reason, the first few years of married life should be 'accompanied'..." Catechumenal Pathways, 74



MARRIAGE MYSTAGOGY

"Ultimately, mystagogical marriage catechesis... addresses the following invitation to the couple: 'Become what you are! You are now spouses; therefore, live more and more as spouses! The Lord has blessed and 'filled' your union with grace, so put that grace to good use!' To accomplish this, spouses should be helped to feel the presence of Christ in the Sacrament of Marriage itself, not only in the other sacraments. Christ is present in their midst as spouses: He nourishes their relationship daily, and they can turn to Him together in prayer. The grace of the sacrament is at work in them and is manifested in their daily lives."

FORMAT OF A CIRCLE GATHERING

A Together in Holiness Circle includes a Host Couple that facilitates and three to five participating couples

Spouses gather **seven times** throughout the year for:

- Meal and fellowship
- Opening prayer and Scripture reading
- Short video
- Group reflection and discussion
- Closing prayer













WHAT IS A HOST COUPLE?

- A man and woman united in the Sacrament of Marriage
- Formed to facilitate times of prayer and discussion
- Models a marriage striving for Christian virtue
- Cultivates friendships with other couples
- Hospitable and encouraging
